

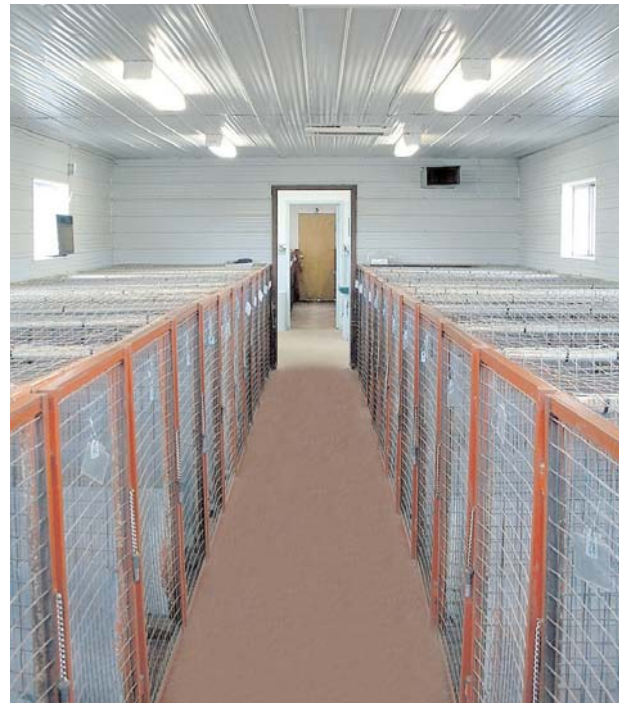

**Why your dog needs twice yearly  
Kennel Cough (bordetella) vaccination  
for admission to Peevers Boarding Kennels**

Our facility and procedures are designed  
to reduce the incidence of kennel cough  
infections in our guests.



The requirement for twice yearly vaccination is a result of our many years of experience plus subsequent consultations and exploring with experts. When our facility opened in 1983, we only required once yearly bordetella (kennel cough) vaccination. Unfortunately, with the once yearly vaccination, from time to time we suffered outbreaks of kennel cough problems. We sought the advice of experts and spent many months reading as much as possible on how best to combat this problem. Twice yearly kennel cough vaccinations were strongly advised. There are no universally accepted recommendations for the frequency of the kennel cough (bordetella) vaccine. Supporting our policy are the recent American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) vaccine guidelines. These recommendations are that the Kennel Cough be administered every six months to dogs that socialize in dog parks, are groomed, show dogs, board frequently or travel to different areas with owners. We hope that this information helps to explain why we have this policy in place. It is truly one prevention as we try to keep your pet(s) both happy and healthy.
